ADDITIONAL REPORTS

Merle Weems gave the following report.

The city has held three negotiation sessions with Mt. Carmel Police Department representatives and another meeting is scheduled in two weeks. Weems reported that everything is going well.

City Inspector Don Price gave the following report.

The City received \$1,540 in licensing fees from a coin operated amusement business location that is now back in business.

Police Chief Jim Seaton gave the following report.

Seaton commended Illinois Department representative Mike Cooper for locating traffic light control boxes which the street department should be able to use in repairing signals on downtown Market Street.

Fire Chief Partee had no report.

Chief Partee invited the council to a Retirement Party for Butch Kingsbury on Wednesday at 6:00.

Street Superintendent Dave Easter had no report.

Water Plant Superintendent Mark Weirich gave the following report.

Weirich commended the Water Maintenance workers for their hard work on fixing all the main breaks around town. Mt. Carmel was selected from among 131 water utilities in the state to complete the study of what costs would be involved in replacing all cast iron water mains and doing other infrastructure work. Four inch cast iron water pipes have been breaking and the City would replace them all if money were no problem.

Waste Water Treatment Manager Rob Windes had no report.

City Engineer Mike Neikirk gave the following report.

Preliminary engineering work for a railroad overpass at Division Street is one of two projects being planned by the City. The other project will involve the extension of Empire Street to serve continued development on the west side along West 9th street. B&D Independence Company will be relocating there from South Market Street. They plan to construct a new facility on Empire Street adjacent to the CST Inc plant's property. The extension of Empire Street will also accommodate future expansion plans of companies there. According to Neikirk, the City has acquired a former grain elevator property to make possible to the development of the railroad overpass. A roadway has been platted in the bypass plans to connect 9th Street to Division.

Economic Development Director Bill Maples gave the following report.

Mr. Maples made mention of Resolution #491, authorizing an application to the U.S. Economic Development Administration for a Basic Planning Grant.
